

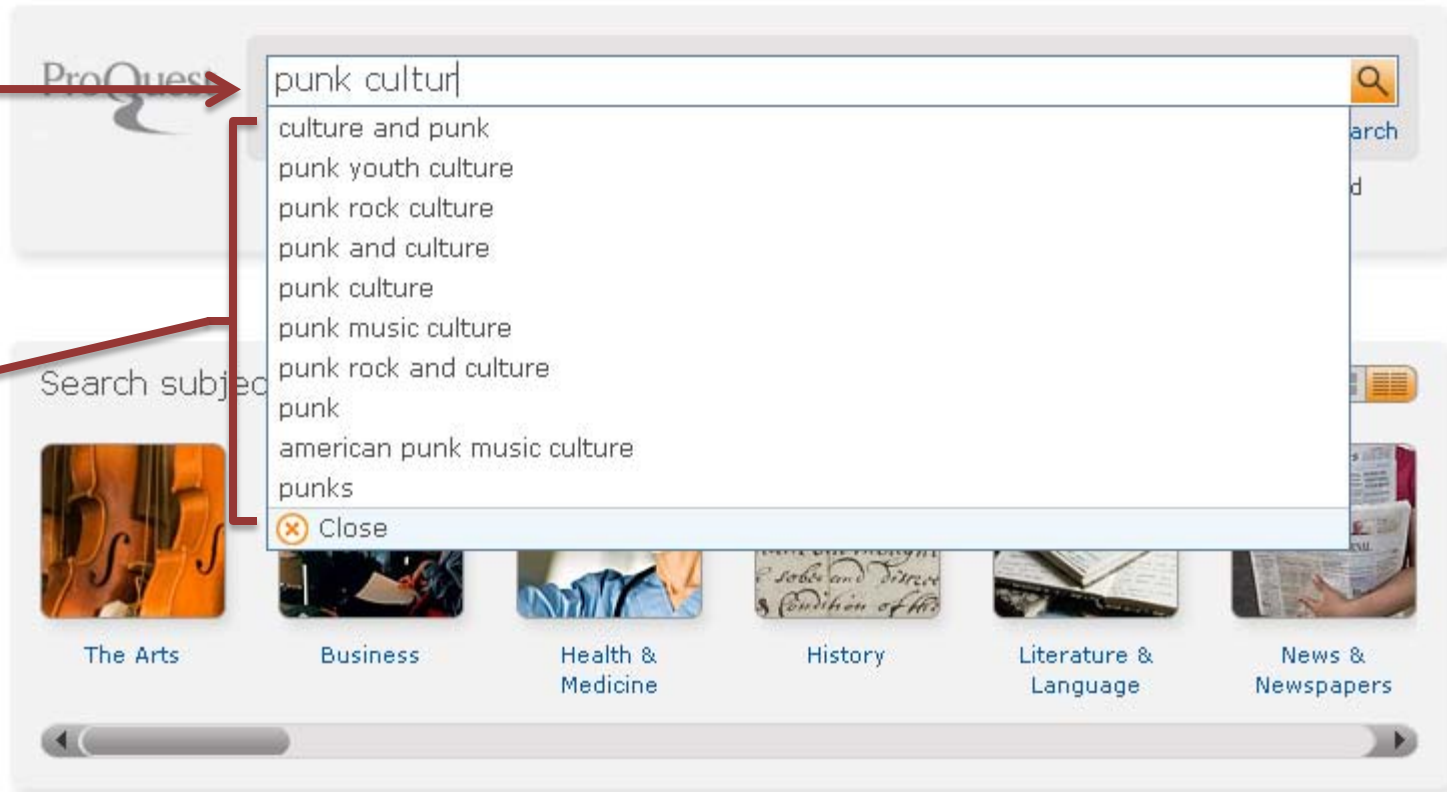

 This database is the only specialist bibliography available for the study of modern and contemporary art. Covers all art forms, from painting, sculpture and photography to video, body art and graffiti. Full abstracts and indexing from the late 1960s onwards.

**Arts & Humanities Full Text** [Search >](#)  
 This database features hundreds of titles covering Art, Architecture, Design, History, Philosophy, Music, Literature, Theatre and Cultural Studies. It is designed to complement the following indexes: ABM, Avery, BHA, BHI, DAAI, Index Islamicus, MLA, Philosopher's Index and RILM.

### Search tip

By default, we will look for documents with all the terms entered.

Use "quotation marks" to search for exact phrases. Separate terms with OR to find any of the words entered.

**Search Results:** Titles of results are displayed in **order of relevance**. There are several ways of **refining your search** in order to **narrow or broaden your results**.

**Limit results to full text and/or scholarly journals.**





Introduction

At a time when the world seems so troubled--war, poverty, hunger, corruption surround us--many young people have found their voices and are speaking up for change. Historically, youth activism was usually found on college campuses and addressed a variety of issues. Today, the issues may still be the same--war, racism, sexism, human rights--but the activists are getting younger and their movement has become global. Thanks to the ease of sharing information through the internet and popular **culture**, young people are sharing knowledge, ideas and actions firmly establishing themselves as vital members of global civil society. They attend protests and marches, distribute pamphlets and lead workshops, and write music and create weblogs. 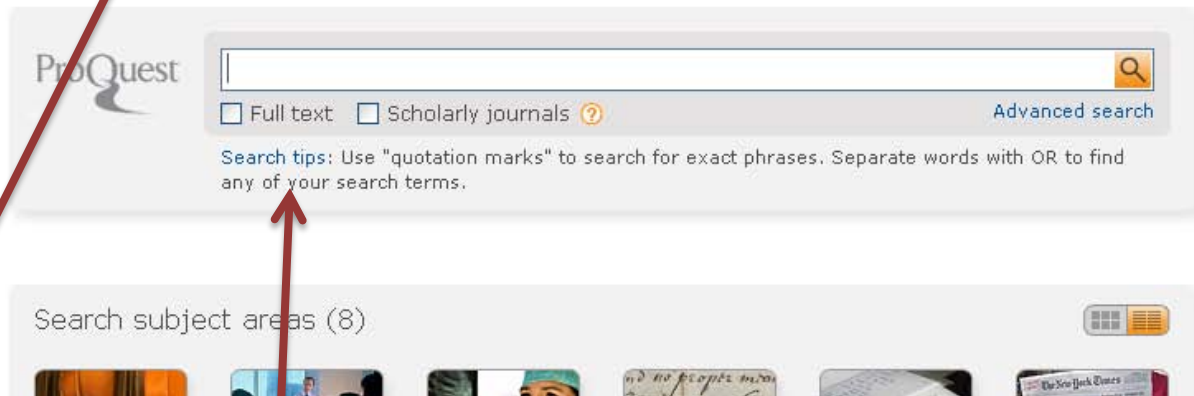
