

The examples below illustrate the kinds of search strategies you can employ in Safari Books Online. Content varies for different Safari subscriptions; therefore, the number of results found using examples below will vary (examples may even yield zero results).

Quick Search

1. Find steps for applying animation to PowerPoint slides
 - **Type *powerpoint animation* in the quick search box and run the search.**
 - **Look through the list of Relevant Sections for an appropriate reference, for example, “Applying an Animation Scheme” from the book *Microsoft® Office PowerPoint 2003*. Click the section title to view the section.**
 - **While viewing the chosen section, the book Table of Contents is listed to the left. Navigation to other sections of the book is available, for example, “Using Slide Transitions”**
2. Find code-fragment examples of java bean
 - **Type *java bean* in the quick search box and select the Code Fragments only check box. Run the search.**
 - **Review the list of Relevant Sections for appropriate matches, or, select the tab View By Section to see a brief context excerpt for recommended sections.**
 - **Click a section title to begin reading.**
3. Find current discussions of intellectual property laws.
 - **Type “*intellectual property*” NEAR *law* in the quick search box and run the search.**
 - **If appropriate, use the category matches in the left column to select an appropriate topical category.**
 - **If desired, click the Pub Date column header to see the most current matches first.**

Browse by Category

1. Find the most current books dealing with networking security
 - **In the Browse By Category section of the left menu, select Networking.**
 - **Next, select the subheading Security. Books are sorted most-current first.**

Advanced Search

1. Find books on Excel published in the past two years
 - **Select the Advanced search link from the Safari quick search area.**
 - **Type *Excel* in the Book Title field, type *2003* in the Year Published From field. Run the search.**
 - **Select a book title to view a book’s home page. From the book home page, you can begin reading from the beginning of the book or use the Table of Contents in the left navigation bar to start at a specific chapter or section.**
 - **To search within the book, select the Current Book checkbox within the quick search area, replace existing search terms with desired keywords (for example, “*pivot table*”), then run the search.**
2. Find quick tips on the subject of e-commerce
 - **Select Advanced search from the quick search area.**
 - **Type *e-commerce* in the Find Results keyword field, then choose the option Tips and how-to’s only. Run the search.**
 - **If appropriate, use Category navigation on the left results menu to choose a topical category.**
